DAME KELLY HOLMES OPENS LIBRA FUNDED BLOOD CANCER UNIT

LIBRA Charity Trustees and our incredible supporter Col Dame Kelly Holmes MBE (mil) recently joined haematology experts to celebrate the grand opening of an enhanced unit for blood cancer patients at King's College Hospital, London. The Derek Mitchell Unit is a purposebuilt chemotherapy and bone marrow transplant ward for young teens and adult patients.

As the official haematology charity for King's, backed by Lions Clubs International, we recently provided £100,000 of funding toward the vital enhancements. Funds have been raised through our current Going for Gold Campaign which was inspired by Dame Kelly.

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During the special event Professor Roopen Arya, Clinical Director for Haematology and Pathology gave a wonderful opening speech.

He provided an overview of the advanced therapies being developed at King's and also thanked LIBRA for our ongoing support.

He was followed by Michelle Kenyon, Nurse Consultant at King's. Michelle spoke about the history of the Derek Mitchell Unit.



Michelle also highlighted the amazing development of transplant nursing at the hospital which is making a huge difference to patient care.

She went on to say how beneficial the newly refurbished Derek Mitchell Unit will be for both the nursing staff and their patients.

Head Of Nursing Haematology Thanks LIBRA

Carole Cobain-Patel, Head of Nursing Haematology at King's said: "Many of our patients are receiving high dose chemotherapy or going through bone marrow transplants. Thanks to LIBRA funding our Young Teenage Adult and End Of Life Rooms on the Derek Mitchell Unit now feature wall beds, enabling loved ones to stay and provide support. Calming wall art has also been installed, making the rooms less clinical, and enhanced bedhead panelling allows for our nurses to administer treatments even more efficiently.

"Thanks to the funding we have also been able to modernise the patient day room on the unit. It will provide a peaceful and healing environment where patients can spend time relaxing or meeting with loved ones. Enhancements include the addition of floor to ceiling windows, providing patients with a view across Ruskin Park. The enhancements are truly transformative and will hugely benefit our patients.

"We rely on the support of LIBRA and there are more exciting projects in the pipeline that we will soon require funds to fulfil.
